- A. 2008-09 MO Prevention Assistance Grant
 - 1. Final report has been submitted
 - 2. We reviewed the outstanding results of the GGC and SCT courses. See attached. It is clear that these classes are a good match for our community.
- B. 2009-2010 Missouri Prevention Assistance Mini-Grant
 - 1. Applied for \$4,909.18 to offer one SCT and one GGC class in the Spring of 2010
 - a. Curriculum \$2,293.58
 - b. Facilitators \$2,300.00
 - c. Countertop document holders to display materials \$315.60
 - 2. Funds will be awarded Nov. 12, 2009
 - 3. The spring classes have been scheduled and will appear in the Family Center catalog. Guiding Good Choices for parents of 4th-7th graders

C. Funds from WMS Social Activities - \$7,826.62

- 1. Think about ways we should use or reserve these funds. We decided we should reserve most of the funds until we have the parent survey results and feedback from the BOE after our report. We did agree to have Peers Protecting Peers submit applications to us for use of the funds.
- 2. We approved giving up to \$500 from a parent library at WMS. Katie Montiel is selecting books and DVDs that WMS parents can check out through the school counselors.
- 3. The WMS Counselors asked if we would sponsor having Tina Meier speak to WMS 6th, 7th, and 8th graders about bullying and cyber-bullying. Tina lost her daughter, Megan, in Oct. 2006 to suicide due to being bullied on the computer. The school presentation is for 1 1/2 hours and costs \$750. A parent component in the evening would cost an additional \$250. We are interested in co-sponsoring the parent portion and suggesting that we also invite Marian McCord from CHADS Coalition to talk about mental health as well.

This question was prompted by a training that Matt attended. He shared that in the 70's marijuana was about 1% THC. Today regular pot is12-15% THC and BC buds are up to 35% THC. They also have THC budders using the THC oil that is up to 95% THC.

Battle of the Belt

- 1. First seat belt check Oct. 12
 - 277 students (86%) had their seat belt on correctly
 - 42 students (13%) did not
- 2. Doing announcements at School
- 3. Get Yo' Buckle on Day Nov. 4 during 4th-6th hours at CHS. Corporal Jeffrey Wilson from the MO State Highway Patrol brought the seat belt convincer to school. Anne also did the fatal vision goggles with students. It went well with someone on the seat belt convincer the entire time.
- 4. Seat belt check on Nov. 4 as a learning opportunity
- 5. Final seat belt check in mid Nov.
