  - c. Educ Climb all students have a record that follows them academic info as well as social emotional to help teachers understand the whole child.
- 2. Updates from SSD
  - a. Formalized partnership
  - b. Added baseline data to track progress
- 3. Wellness Center
  - a. Approved bid to build out space
  - b. SW hired to run program and has already started seeing kids
  - c. Student consultants to help director make decisions about the program

- 3. PTOs are free to engage contracts and vendors of their choosing.
- 4. Sometimes the district makes purchases on PTOs behalf and sends them invoices. This can be helpful to the PTOs not to have to file taxes on purchases.
- 5. Request was made for more communication between the district and the PTOs regarding contracts.

## New Business - Jessica Graetz and Jenny Abeles, PTO Council Co-Presidents

- 1. Can yearbook and school supplies be centralized? Each school should figure out how they handle yearbooks and school supplies, and report back to PTO Council.
- Dr. Weins asked for SSD presentation regarding inclusion for events 20 minutes the
  question was asked whether we should have her come here, or each individual school
  PTOs. PTO Presidents decided they would rather have Dr. Weins come to their
  meetings.
