

CHS Students Shine as Research Scientists



Jiabei Han and Yiyun Xu, students at Clayton High School, were accepted into the Students and Teachers as Research Scientists (STARS) program from the University of Missouri in St. Louis (UMSL). They were two of 36 students in the 2021 STARS class. The program ran from June 7 to July 16.

As a part of the program, students

spend their program creating a research paper on a scientific topic of their choice. Each student was assigned a professional mentor. Throughout the six weeks, they researched their topics as well as participated in activities and lectures. STARS offered daily lectures from professors on topics based on knowledge from their respective fields. In addition,

college admission counselors met with students with tips on how to apply to college. To accommodate the current conditions, UMSL included remote/online work to replace oncampus work for the program. Learn more here.

It's easy to get busy with day to day tasks and forget to plan for snacks and meal times. Prevent running to the store while hungry or settling for an unhealthy snack by following these tips:

- Snack Prep: Prepare healthy snacks once a week for the week ahead. Portion fruit, trail mixes, and other nutrient dense items for easy access.
- Smart Shopping: Shop after eating a meal when you are full. Store a snack for on the go such as protein bars, fruit bars, and cheese sticks.
- Mindful Eating: Try eating snacks and meals with no distractions. Eating while
 watching television or talking on the phone can distract you. This can lead to
 oversnacking because one is not focused on how the food is making them feel.
- Stay Hydrated: Drink a cup of water before meals can help one feel more full.
